Summary of Advocacy Committee Meeting January 24, 2018

1. Call to order

Steve Arms called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm MST, January 24, 2018, in Albuquerque, NM. Attendance is recorded in Attachment 1.

2. Approval of minutes

Minutes were not considered at this meeting.

3. PowerPoint Presentation and Discussion

Steve Arms asked Advocacy Committee members to introduce themselves and then he presented the powerpoint of the Advocacy Committee's role, agenda, and membership along with accomplishments for the past six months. Jerry Parr asked that Regional meetings be added to the agenda for this meeting.

Conference Planning: Steve turned the presentation over to Jerry Parr for the section on conference planning. Jerry reported that the NEMC steering committee was considering a Wednesday night event at the WW II Museum in New Orleans. The cost would be around \$30 per attendee. Members agreed this was a good idea.

Jerry reminded members that the next winter meeting would be in Milwaukee, WI. He noted that the hotel was in a prime location for easy walking to restaurants and other sights.

Jerry also asked for feedback on this meeting. Comments included:

- Need more time for the Mentor Session (full day)
- The schedule is too compressed. There is a lot of overlap of good sessions. Don't compress it any more.
- What happened to the plastic bags? Kay Parr reported that TNI was searching for a greener option that didn't make as much noise as the plastic bags. So far this has been hard to find. Trinity offered to help and share some research she had done for another meeting.

Regional Meetings: Jerry reviewed the regional meetings where TNI had been requested to speak. These included:

- TCEQ Environmental Trade Fair in early May. Jerry will speak.
- Oregon Environmental Lab Association. This event is in mid-April. Jerry usually goes, but travel is difficult. Lee Wolf volunteered to speak.
- CWEA. This event is in Sacramento the day after the Oregon meeting. Jerry was invited, but wonders if someone else can go. Possibilities include Mitzi Miller and

- Trinity O'Neal. Note: After the conference, CWEA was adamant that they wanted Jerry to speak since his talk had been advertised.
- FSEA. This conference is in May. TNI has not submitted an abstract. Jerry will discuss with Robin Cook.

Highlights of the Albuquerque Meeting: Steve asked members to mention highlights of the meeting that might need follow up by the Advocacy Committee. Highlights included:

- TNI needs to develop a white paper on the FL experience with NELAP accreditation. There is misinformation going around that labs have closed because of accreditation. Carl Kircher explained what actually happened and why the numbers appear to show that. Carl's presentation should be a white paper.
- Examples of why documentation matters. Jack Farrell is a good resource for this.
- The cost of documentation. TNI may have done this before. We should check.
- How do we know if NELAP accreditation improves data quality? Start with the premise that PT pass rates should improve and precision should get better.
- Steve Arms will call Steve Weisberg in CA to see if they can do a study on the CA labs that would answer the above questions.
- FL DoH is starting the process of writing regulations for cannabis testing labs. TNI should weigh in and promote use of the TNI standard for accreditation. Jerry asked Carol to draft a letter to the FL DoH outlining the benefits of the TNI standard.
- Based on staff discussions, the Advocacy Committee will draft an SOP on Advocacy document control.
- The Advocacy Committee along with the Policy Committee will do a pilot project on the use of Power DMS for document sharing.
- APHL has requested an article from TNI for their next newsletter. Jerry will do the first draft.
- It is important to publicize why the new standard is better. We should prepare a white paper on the benefits of the new standard. Each expert committee will provide the first cut a language for the paper. Advocacy will combine into one document.
- ABs have requested more technical training from TNI. We should change our system so that technical training is rolled into the ABs annual fee. In addition, ABs would like to be able to review technical training that TNI provides to laboratories.
