# Summary of Advocacy Committee Meeting January 25, 2017

#### 1. Call to order

Steve Arms called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm CST, January 25, 2017, in Houston, Texas. Attendance is recorded in Attachment 1.

#### 2. Approval of minutes

Minutes were not considered at this meeting.

#### 3. PowerPoint Presentation

Steve Arms presented the powerpoint of the Advocacy Committee's role and membership along with accomplishments for the past six months. Participants suggested that the TNI Ambassadors be added to the list of accomplishments.

Conference Planning: Steve turned the presentation over to Jerry Parr for the section on conference planning, Jerry stated that for the winter 2018 meeting he had received proposals from Hyatt Hotels in Albuquerque, NM, Wichita, KS, Seattle, WA, and Aurora, CO. After reviewing and discussing the pros and cons of each proposal, attendees suggested that Jerry continue negotiations for Albuquerque, NM.

Jerry reminded the group that the NEMC summer meeting is scheduled to be at the Grand Hyatt in Washington, DC. The theme is "Communicating Science". For the TNI portion of the meeting, we will try to schedule Warren Merkel to do another update on changes to ISO/IEC 17025. This will be a half day session.

**Highlights of the Houston Meeting:** Steve asked members to mention highlights of the meeting that may need follow up by the Advocacy Committee. Highlights included:

- Session on changes to ISO/IEC 17025
- The First Timers session was well received, more than half full
- The Method Update Rule did not happen
- Great attendance and participation at the small lab mentoring session
- The assessment forum was well received and well attended
- Revisions to ISO 17011 were a big topic of discussion in the LAB expert committee meeting
- NEFAP noted that the NEFAP advocacy video is not on the TNI website
- Good meeting with EPA drinking water staff and discussions were initiated to coordinate DW program and accreditation body evaluations
- Advocacy can help with outreach to regions. Some EPA staff feels that TNI makes no effort to communicate. Need to start mending fences. Find opportunities to communicate to RS&T directors. Was suggested that Steve Arms send an

- introductory email to RS&T directors in his new role as Lead Evaluator. Advocacy can then take some time to plan additional outreach activities.
- Outreach to EPA program offices should be put on hold until the new administration is established.
- The chemistry module will have to be re-opened for 3 sections. Revisions could take several months.
- The NGAB working group and TNRC plan to present a proposal for reorganization of recognition activities to the TNI Board. Three NGABs were recognized at this meeting. TNI will need to determine which states can accept an NGAB accreditation. The laboratory accreditation flow chart on the website needs to be updated.
- Need to have updated newsletter article on the status of 2016-2017 standards. Article should include information on how standards are developed, and adopted, and what role ANSI plays in the process.
- The NEFAP EC discussed marketing efforts and expanding their scope to include cannabis and food.
- Advocacy should consider expanding the ambassador program to other states.
- Advocacy should continue to find ways to promote the benefits of accreditation. For example, problems with DNA labs could have potentially been addressed with an accreditation program. This is how environmental labs addressed the problem.
