1. Call to order

a. Introduction

- b. **Public** promotes confidence that environmental decisions are based on reliable, authentic data
- c. **Organizations** –accreditation promotes ongoing self-evaluation and continuous improvement and provides an effective system for accountability and enhances its reputation.

Suggested speaker: Kim Watson

d. **Government** – serves as a basis to ensure that environmental monitoring data are adequate for their intended purpose.

Suggested speakers: Lara Phelps (FEM competency memos), Brian Schumacher (importance of competency in field sampling and measurements), someone from EPA Region IV, Jordan Adelson

e. **Data Users** – provides assurance that the laboratory has been evaluated and has met accepted standards established by and with the profession

Suggested speakers: state agency program person or lawyer, TCEQ (Anne Strahl or Anne (Rhyne) Panko), Fred, Janice Willey, Jordan

f. **Profession** – advances the field by promoting uniform accepted standards of practice and advocating rigorous adherence to these standards.
