Summary of the NELAP Accreditation Council Meeting Monday, January 3, 2022 1:30 pm Eastern

1. Welcome and Introductions

Kristin welcomed everyone to the meeting. The minutes of December 6 were approved unanimously. Attendance is noted in Attachment 1.

2. Discussion of PT Issue Raised by New Hampshire

Bill Hall notified his Lead Evaluator of the following:

During the last evaluation we were written up for not grading misreported PTs as Not Acceptable. Wrong versions of a method may be chosen or a wrong analyte chosen from the PTP during the upload process. For a while I was attempting to meet this requirement. This has become a ridiculous battle. In trying to get to the root cause of the problem I have found that the PTP are half the problem. Some don't use the TNI method codes and some have their own variations of the method codes. This causes confusion and a great chance for error. I can't fix them to my knowledge. Bear in mind, reporting PTs is not like anything a lab routinely performs. Set procedures are in place for "normal' reporting techniques. These work just fine. Going forward, I will correct these issues, require corrected / reissued reports and corrective action. Hopefully, going forward the labs will adequately address the issues. Re-grading these results as Not Acceptable causes more work for me that I don't have time to perform. This issue needs to be addressed maybe at the NELAP and PTP level.

With Bill's permission, Lynn shared the message with both Jerry Parr and the PTPEC Chair, Shawn Kassner. Shawn invited Bill to join the PTPEC calls to discuss this; Jerry suggested a workgroup to resolve the issue(s). Apparently this is a long-standing issue, never successfully resolved.

Participants in this Council meeting were asked to share their thoughts. Travis noted that this issue aligns with the PTRL issue he raised to the Council in mid-2021, which has become a low priority issue for PTPEC to address.

It seems that the new method format for Clean Water Act methods forces labs to use different method codes for reporting PT samples, codes that may not match the method code used by the AB for accreditation. Three additional ABs acknowledged efforts to deal with the passing PT that was just reported in such a way that it doesn't match the code for the accredited method. One has changed the PTs to "fail", one sometimes offers "grace" to its labs, and one has modified its certification manual to direct labs to specific method codes that are allowable (noting that this AB's database may be more accommodating to such a change than others).

All appear to recognize that they are unable to alter the root cause of the problem, but can only find workarounds to deal with it. There was general support for a workgroup with PTPEC, to include the PT providers, in order to resolve this problem before it gets any worse.

3. Remote Participation in NELAP AC Conference Session

All ABs present were polled about attendance at conference, and the non-travelers will be offered the opportunity to participate by WebEx. Two ABs will have non-voting

representatives sitting at the head table (TX and LDEQ) with either the designated representative or alternate participating remotely. Those not present at this meeting will also receive WebEx invitations.

4. New Business

Cathy noted that Shane Wyatt is Virginia's new Director of Lab Operations.

5. Next Meeting

The conference session for the Council is scheduled for Wednesday, January 19, 2022, at 1 pm Central time. Remote participation has been arranged for those who cannot be present in San Antonio for this session -- a WebEx invitation that includes the call-in number (if computer audio is not available) will be distributed the morning of the meeting day to those who have indicated they will not be in San Antonio.

The next teleconference meeting of the NELAP AC is scheduled for Monday, February 7, 2022, at 1:30 pm Eastern. An agenda and documents will be provided in advance.
