Summary of the TNI NELAP Board Meeting March 2, 2009

1. Roll call

The NELAP Board met at 12:30 PM CST on March 2, 2009. Those members in attendance are listed in Attachment 1. Susan Wyatt, MN, AB applicant, also joined the call.

2. Minutes

Minutes from the 3-2-09 meeting were reviewed and approved for posting.

3. Issue from PT Expert Committee

The NELAP Board re-visited the issue brought up by the PT expert committee as a result of the LASC recommendations. Some labs with secondary accreditation in NY use PTs provided by New York for their PT's to their primary accreditor. However, if a lab does not have accreditation for the particular method in NY, the NY system marks the PT results as unacceptable regardless of the actual result. Also, it is an extremely rare occurrence that a lab would report a method not on their New York scope. The PT committee has not been able to find acceptable language to fix this issue without putting someone in violation of the standard, because the standard was not designed to consider an AB to be a PT provider.

Stephanie Ostrowski, NY, along with Dan Dickinson, had agreed to report back to the NELAP Board on this issue. Dan reported that NY's system for PT reporting did indeed mark a PT score as invalid if the lab was not accredited for that method in NY. He noted that an AB can change a PT score according to 7.3 of Module 3 of the new PT standards. Dan also noted that most ABs operating where this is an issue, know to check for this, and do in fact, change the scores. Dan Hickman noted that the PT expert committee had asked for help in resolving this matter and Dan H. asked Dan Dickinson to propose language for the PT expert committee. Dan D. suggested that it is out of sequence to propose language at this time. It does not qualify as a potential TIA.

3. Update on renewals

First round:

CA –Corrective action response date extended to March 11

6. Whole Effluent Toxicity FoPT Tables

Dan reminded all members that a vote on the WET FoPT tables would be taken at the March 16 meeting. This vote is very important so that Patrick Yellin of EPA can send a letter to labs advising them that if they are doing NELAP PTs they do not have to do DMRQA samples.
